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this account of how serial killers impact society is a compelling examination of the media phenomenon of the celebrity criminal in american culture joyce carol oates jeffrey dahmer ted bundy john wayne gacy serial killers have become iconic figures in america the subject of made for tv movies and mass market paperbacks alike but why do we find such luridly transgressive and horrific individuals so fascinating what compels us to look more closely at these figures when we really want to look away natural born celebrities considers how serial killers have become lionized in american culture and explores the consequences of their fame david schmid provides a historical account of how serial killers became famous and how that fame has been used in popular media and the corridors of the fbi alike

ranging from h h holmes whose killing spree during the 1893 chicago world s fair inspired the devil in the white city right up to aileen wuornos the lesbian prostitute whose vicious murder of seven men would serve as the basis for the hit film monster schmid unveils a new understanding of serial killers by emphasizing both the social dimensions of their crimes and their susceptibility to multiple interpretations and uses he also explores why serial killers have become endemic in popular culture from their depiction in film and tv to their becoming the stuff of trading cards and even sites where you can buy their hair and nail clippings persuasively argued meticulously researched it is highly readable as well joyce carol oates

killer fandom is the first long form treatment of serial killer fandom fan studies have mostly ignored this most moralized form of fandom as a stigmatized bad other in implicit tension with the field s successful campaign to recuperate the broader fan category yet serial killer fandom as judith may fathallah shows in the book can be usefully studied with many of the field s leading analytic frameworks after tracing the pre digital history of fans mediated celebrity and killers fathallah examines contemporary fandom through the lens of textual poaching affective community subcultural capital and play with close readings of fan posts comments and mashups on tumblr tiktok and youtube alongside documentaries podcasts and a thriving murderabilia industry killer fandom argues that this fan culture is in many ways hard to distinguish from more mainstream fandoms fan creations around aileen wuornos jeffrey dahmer ted bundy and richard ramirez among others demonstrate a complex and shifting stance toward their objects marked by parodic humor and irony in many cases killer fandom ultimately questions given our crime and violence saturated media culture whether it makes sense to set dahmer and wuornos fans apart from the rest of us

from reality television to celebrity gossip magazines today s technologies have enabled a vast number of personal narratives that document our existence and that of others multiple academic disciplines now define the self as fluid and entirely changeable little more than a performance that is chosen according to the situation while news journalists still pursue the authentic narrative advertising and politics might be accused of exploiting the narrative tendency and across media the personal and public become increasingly merged real lives celebrity stories collects research from published and experienced professionals practitioners and scholars who discuss narratives of real people across cultures and history and in multiple media it uses narrative theory to interrogate the processes by which we create promote and consume these stories of real people and the ways in which we construct our own stories of self by bringing together different disciplines it offers a theory of the production s of self in public spaces such as television cinema comics fan cultures music news media politics and cyberspace

focuses on the careers of some successful self promoters including alcibiades socrates alexander the great and others this book investigates the secrets of their success and looks at ways in which other talented individuals turned themselves into celebrities including sports personalities entertainers philosophers and others

the growth of mass communication and adversary journalism have helped to create a culture in which the heroic is trivialized and celebrity is commonly mistaken for heroism in this book keyes explains the foundations of heroism demonstrates clearly where the confusion lies and offers practical ways to get to the sense of true heroism and pass it on to our culture and our kids

the goal of this volume is to discuss and analyze various contours of violence as it is made manifest around the world this foundational collection of essays stories and poems represent a wide variety of disciplines and perspectives the unifying theme is that violence is not a thing but rather a dynamic force occurring among separate conscious minds that is enhanced by the careful scrutiny of social science

people able to speak intelligently about blood spatter patterns and organized vs disorganized serial killers through the suggestion that certain kinds of killers are monstrous or outside the realm of human morality and through the perpetuation of the stranger danger idea the true crime aesthetic has both responded to and fostered our culture's fears true crime is also the site of a dramatic confrontation with the concept of evil and one of the few places in american public discourse where moral terms are used without any irony and notions and definitions of evil are presented without ambiguity when seen within its historical context true crime emerges as a vibrant and meaningful strand of popular culture one that is unfortunately devalued as lurid and meaningless pulp

this anthology examines a number of issues related to violence within the media landscape violence has been a topic of continued concern within american culture and society although there have been numerous sociological and historical studies of violence and its origins there is relatively little systematic analysis of violence within media representation even as this issue becomes preeminent within public discourse this anthology examines a number of issues related to violence within the media landscape using various methodologies to suggest the implications of the increasing obsession with violence for postmodern civilization

in this entertaining compendium the true crime historian and jezebel columnist investigates female serial killers through the ages when it comes to violent crime women are typically thought of as the victims not the perpetrators the bias is so pervasive that in 1998 fbi profiler roy hazelwood declared there are no female serial killers but what about tillie klimek moulay hassan kate bender and the other notorious women profiled here in lady killers tori telfer reveals the shocking true stories of fourteen women who despite being largely forgotten by history rival their male counterparts in cunning cruelty and appetite for destruction each chapter explores the crimes and history of a different serial killer and then unpacks her legacy and portrayal in the media as well as the stereotypes and sexist clichés that inevitably surround her the first book to examine female serial killers through a feminist lens with a witty and dryly humorous tone lady killers dismisses tired tropes she was a femme fatale a black widow a witch and delves into the complex reality of female aggression and predation featuring 14 illustrations from dame darcy it is a bloodcurdling insightful and irresistible journey into the heart of darkness

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
